

How to DOUBLE APPLIQUE

SPECIAL NOTES:

This PDF may not show the same DESIGN you are making but the steps are the same 😊.

Materials:

Medium- heavy weight cutaway Stabilizer

1 PIECE OF BLUE MATERIAL OF CHOICE

1 PIECE OF YELLOW MATERIAL OF CHOICE

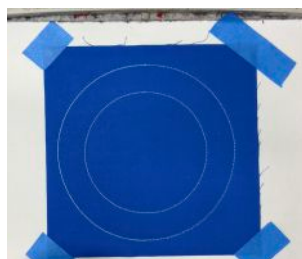
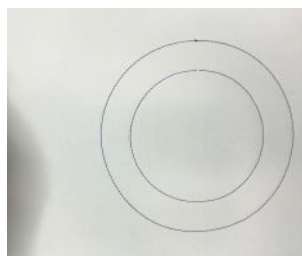
painter's tape

Before we get start stitching, let's look at the Color StopPDF that came in yourzip file.



The DOUBLE APPLIQUE in this PDF has 14 Color stops, yours may have more, but that's ok. This PDF will work for anySTFA connector.

Color stop 1 is the Die line that will show you where to place your BLUE material of choice the thread color is denotes what color the applique should be. Color stop 2 is the tack down for this applique. Color stop 3 is the die line for the YELLOW applique. Color stop 4 is the tack down for that part of the applique. Colors stops 5-14 are the designs elements.



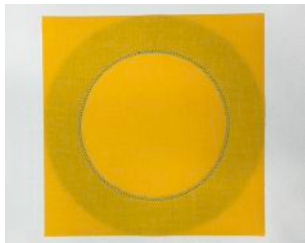
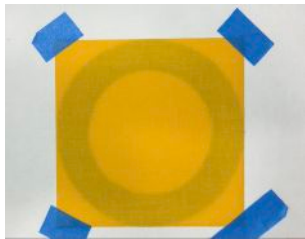
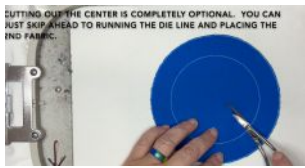
Step 1: Guess what step 1 is? If you guessed Hoop a piece of medium-heavy cutaway stabilizer. You can also hoop whatever you are putting the design on or float it, your choice.

Step 2: Run Color

Stop1 This is going to give you the die line, so you know where in the hoop to place your BLUE applique material.

Step 3: Place your blue material of choice. You can use a little 505 spray to hold it in place or a little blue painter's tape works well too. Make sure your vinyl covers up your die line completely. **Run Color stop 2**

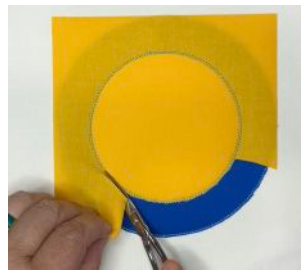
Step 4: Carefully trim around the outside of your blue applique.



Step 5 IS OPTIONAL: if your yellow material wish show the blue bleeding through. Carefully take your scissors and poke a hole just through the center blue material. Then cut to the edge of the inner tack down and applique trim around the inside of the circle. This is also a good idea to do if using thicker applique materials.

Step 6. Run Color Stop 3
This is the die line for the yellow applique.

Step 7: Place your yellow applique material and **RUN color stop 4.**



Step 8: Carefully trim around the yellow applique.

Step 9: Put the hoop back on your machine and run the remaining color stops to add the design.

That's it, you're done. It wasn't as hard as you thought, was it?



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
